

Directions

From the North: Take Interstate 295 South to the Atlantic City Expressway East for about .5 miles and bear right to Rt. 55 towards Glassboro. Take Rt. 55 South to exit 50A (Route 322 East) Go 5 lights and turn right onto Route 47 South (Delsea Drive). On Route 47 travel approx. 2.5 miles. Office Complex is on right. Government Services Building is the first building on the left, park in front of building.

From the Delaware Memorial Bridge: Take NJ Turnpike to exit 2 (Swedesboro). Make right off of exit onto 322 East. Continue on Route 322 through Mullica Hill east towards Glassboro. After crossing Rt. 55 overpass in Richwood, go 5 lights and turn right onto Route 47 South (Delsea Drive) On Route 47 travel approx. 2.5 miles. Office Complex is on right. Government Services Building is the first building on the left, park in front of building.
